
Perverse Verse, short poems, previously published and new. Humorous (often black) yet reflective. Poetry from someone outside the mainstream of contemporary poetry (outside academia). It will appeal to baby boomers, the hip general and literate reader and lovers of wordplay.

Themes: youth/ageing; success/failure; love/sex/ relationships; nature/ the environment/technology; identity/mental health/illness. The author explores how we live now in our contemporary screwed-up world using sophisticated wit and a liberal use of rhyme. Readers need not labour trying to de-code the poems because the language is accessible and clear; there is no obscurity. Frankness and provocation abound.
